

Korean Prayer Project Reports:

In 2022 the team from South Korea was one of 20 teams who went to 20 American cities. These prayer teams came as an act of gratitude in response to the 50-year anniversary of Billy Graham holding crusades in their nation of Korea. The result of those crusades brought both spiritual and economic awakening to Korea. Fifty years later, the children and grandchildren of those saved in that crusade came to America to pray for a spiritual awakening in this land. They prayed with the belief that, if revival comes to America, it will affect the nations of the world. Their fervency in prayer left deposits that bore great fruit. Just a little over a month later, on June 24, 2022, Roe v Wade was overturned and abortion was no longer the law of the land. Then, in February 2023, the Asbury Revival broke out. We believe that both of these monumental occurrences were the result of prayer.

In May 2023, the church from South Korea sent 40 teams to pray in 40 cities across America. We were blessed to have the youngest team. Traveling almost a 1000 miles for the week, this young team prayed over college campuses, houses of prayer, and churches across the DFW Metroplex. One of the highlights of the 2023 team was being part of Rockwall Exalt. This stadium gathering culminated with worship and prayer on the football field. The Korean team was right in the middle of it all. In fact, they closed the night out praying from the platform, making declarations of revival and awakening coming to Texas. As a likely result, many high school prayer groups were birthed just following the event in Rockwall county and beyond.

This year 2024, we have much joy and anticipation for the team coming. The dedication of these Koreans to take off work and raise finances to come to pray for our nation is noteworthy. They come with the sole purpose of praying over churches and pulpits to see revival and awakening in our nation. This is humbling. This group of 9 intercessors from Korea have one request: they want to pray. They want to soak the ground of Texas with their tears of intercession. Their cry is a steadfast one asking for God to send revival and awakening.

Our focus this year is on churches. We will be at three main ones that carry much significance. On Wednesday, May 1, we will be at Gateway Grand Prairie Church. This church is at the geographic center of the DFW Metroplex and has the building that was one of the first Houses of Prayer in our nation. This is where we will be having our Wednesday night service. In addition, Gateway Church is a church of great influence not only in the Metroplex, but in the nations. They boldly stand with Israel and have a global reach in worship and evangelism. On Thursday, May 2nd, we will be with the Church of Prayer in Fate, Texas. This church is located in Rockwall, the smallest county of Texas, but because of prayer has international influence. On Thursday, we will also be part of a mayor's breakfast and the National Day of Prayer and on Friday, May 3rd, we will be in the Church of Prayer prayer room and helping host [Exalt: A United Cry for Texas](#). This stadium event is an invitation to prayer for all of Texas. We believe the Koreans' prayers are foundational to this gathering. Finally, on Saturday, May 4th, we will be at Prayer Mountain at Mountain Creek Church in Dallas. Prayer Mountain is the highest place in the Metroplex and is both an organized and organic expression of prayer. People come from all nations to walk the grounds and pray over this area. We

believe the Koreans coming and praying from this strategic location will partner with God's heart for this region. TO GOD BE THE GLORY!
